From dense boreal forests to bale-speckled cultivated sections, the massive diversity of terrain in Alberta's expansive elk habitat is conducive to hunters of all kinds and abilities. Archery and rifle hunters from around the world visit Alberta annually to cash in on the high population, excellent genetics, and eagerness of our elk to engage.



As recently as 2020, a bull scoring 449 ½" B&C was taken in Alberta... you could be the next to capitalize on our growing herds and strong genetics!

Best of all, this permit is open to year-round hunting! This Minister's Special Licence (MSL) allows the buyer an unprecedented opportunity to hunt at the best possible times, extending their chances to a full 365 days of unparalleled possibilities with any weapon, and in any zone where an elk season exists. Don't miss your chance to bid on this world-class hunt.



LICENCE CONDITIONS

The holder of this Antlered Elk Minister's Special Licence (MSL) is authorized to hunt one antlered elk, in accordance with all provisions of the Wildlife Act and Wildlife Regulation unless exempted in the conditions below.

This special licence is valid from August 25, 2025, to August 24, 2026, in any Wildlife Management Unit (WMU) where an elk hunting season is identified in the current Alberta Guide to Hunting Regulations.

- This licence may be held by hunters of any residency status, however, a licence holder who is not an Alberta resident must enter into a contract with the holder of a valid Outfitter Permit and be accompanied by a designated guide in accordance with the Wildlife Regulation.
- This licence does not authorize hunting in any location where hunting is prohibited as outlined in the Wildlife Regulation and the current Alberta Guide to Hunting Regulations.



- This licence does not authorize hunting on Sunday in WMUs where the Sunday hunting of big game is prohibited.
- While hunting under the authority of this licence the hunter may use any legal weapon as defined in the Wildlife Regulation. A crossbow licence or bow hunting permit must be obtained by the MSL licence holder should they choose to hunt with these weapons. Please note that the use of rifles during archery seasons should be undertaken with extreme caution and consideration as archery hunters may be using decoys to hunt several big game species. Please be considerate of other hunters to avoid conflicts and ensure safe hunting for all.
- A hunter is required to hold a Wildlife Certificate before hunting and, when hunting with a bow must, hold a bow hunting permit. This approval does not exempt the MSL holder from the need to follow weapons use restrictions governed by other applicable legislation and regulations, including municipal bylaws.
- This licence opportunity may not be designated to a hunter or licence holder via fee or remuneration (may not be sold or exchanged for value).

NOTE

10% will be deducted from the final bid price of this special licence, which will be dedicated to the Western Hunting and Conservation Expo. If the winner of this item refuses to pay the premiums required, the licence shall be offered to the next highest bidder for the last price they bid.
